

"No Man Knows What His Future Holds"

(Job 1:20-21) (Exodus 3:11-12) (1 Samuel 17:45-47)

Good morning, church! Today, we are reminded of a profound truth: *No man knows what his future holds*. Life is full of uncertainty — trials and triumphs, joys and sorrows — but through it all, we can trust that God is in control. To explore this truth, we'll look at the lives of three key Bible figures: **Job, Moses, and David** — each of whom faced an uncertain future but ultimately found strength and direction in God.

Sermon Overview

Scripture Passage (Job 1:20-21)

1. Job – Trusting God Through Suffering

"The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord."

Job was a man of integrity and faith, yet he endured unimaginable loss. In a single day, he lost his children, his wealth, and his health. Job had no idea what the future held, but despite his suffering, he trusted in God's sovereignty. Even when his friends doubted and his wife told him to curse God and die, Job declared, *"Though He slay me, yet will I trust Him"* (Job 13:15).

Life Application: We may face seasons of suffering and loss, but like Job, we must anchor our faith in God's faithfulness, even when we don't understand His plan.

2. Moses – Walking by Faith, Not by Sight

Scripture Passage: (Exodus 3:11-12)

"But Moses said to God, 'Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?' And God said, 'I will be with you.'"

Moses never imagined that God would call him to lead Israel out of slavery. He was a fugitive, living in the wilderness, feeling inadequate and unqualified. But God's plan was greater than Moses could see. Despite his fears, Moses obeyed God's calling and witnessed miraculous deliverance.

Life Application: When God calls us to step out in faith, we may feel unprepared and fearful. But like Moses, we must trust that God equips those He calls.

3. David – Facing Giants with Faith

Scripture Passage: (1 Samuel 17:45-47)

"David said to the Philistine, 'You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the Lord Almighty.'"

David was just a shepherd boy when he faced the giant Goliath. He had no idea that this battle would set the course for his future as king of Israel. He didn't rely on his strength but trusted in the power of God. Through faith, David overcame his greatest challenge.

Life Application: We all face giants in life — fear, doubt, and uncertainty — but like David, we must trust that God's strength is greater than any obstacle we face.

Conclusion:

Job didn't know how his suffering would end. Moses didn't know how God would deliver Israel. David didn't know that slaying Goliath would lead to his kingship. They all faced an uncertain future — but they placed their trust in God.

We don't know what tomorrow holds — but we know Who holds tomorrow. Let us walk by faith, trusting that God's plans are greater than our understanding.
